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ADMINISTRATORS' UPDATE

AS MEMBERS WILL BE AWARE, ON 15 NOVEMBER 2021, THE REGISTRAR OF INDIGENOUS CORPORATIONS, SELWYN BUTTON, PLACED NJERnda ABORIGINAL CORPORATION UNDER SPECIAL ADMINISTRATION.

Update from Special Administrators Jack James and Paula Smith from Rodgers Reidy, Perth.

The special administration is progressing well and we are well advanced in stage 2, which is aiming to restore good operational order.

We expect to move into stage 3 shortly.

Stage 1: Take control of the assets, including bank accounts; build a complete picture of issues and challenges; and establish a clear plan of action.
- **Complete**

Stage 2: Restore good operational order.
- **In progress**

Stage 3: Prepare the corporation for return to members control.
- **Pending**

Extension of special administration:

The special administration was due to end on 20 May 2022. The registrar will extend it to 17 June 2022 so we can:

- Review the executive staff structure
- Obtain feedback about proposed changes to the rule book
- Seek nominations from members to be appointed to the new board
- Hold the 2020-21 annual general meeting (AGM)

COMMUNITY MEETING FEEDBACK

FROM CEO TRACEY DILLON

I attended the first of what will be many Njernda Community Meetings on May 12.

As CEO, I am committed to listening and learning and it was great to see so many people come along, and wanting to be part of the yarning about our plans, ideas and future as Njernda, and as a community.

There were many issues raised, and, after each community meeting I will provide feedback on actions and progress on each item.

FEEDBACK FROM MEETING MAY 12

- Community engagement was raised as a concern. Our organisation's turnover runs into millions of dollars and it is part of the CEO's accountabilities to manage the organization accordingly. But I do acknowledge and commit to better engaging with community. I will ensure that community engagement is ongoing, perhaps with the assistance of a designated position for this purpose. I will also ensure that staff as part of their roles also engage with community appropriately.
- There is a perception that there is bullying and harassment of staff within the organization. As a result of those comments all staff have now undergone mandatory bullying and harassment training. It was mentioned the Board should undergo that training as well - this will be followed up once a Board is appointed in the coming month.
- Njernda has grown and with more staff we've outgrown the current office accommodation. We are seeking more office accommodation - also factoring in the need for community space.
- Participants noted they were not receiving notices of meetings. I have noted this - another issue raised community member conversations was that members were taken off the membership list. I have checked those members, and although they were listed they did not have addresses next to their names. Staff have been asked to check their client and community contacts and update the appropriate person/s if they are aware of Community members who have re-located. But also, please ensure your details are up to date, if you have changed address, so we can keep you informed. and for community members to also provide advice about any changes to their current addresses. Please note that at the upcoming AGM the sign in sheet for Members will provide an opportunity for Members to provide their email address and preferred method of contact for future information, notices and updates to be distributed.

SUPPORTING ABORIGINAL BUSINESSES

Community members raised that they would like for Njernda to support Aboriginal businesses. I am taking steps to create a register of local Aboriginal businesses and how we can support them.

We are creating a list of Aboriginal businesses that have been sourced from Supply Nation (this is a website directory of Registered Aboriginal Businesses) - a useful resource for all of us. It's in Njernda's and the community's interest to support, engage and employ our locals when and where we can.

SPENT CONVICTIONS

The topic was raised of the spent convictions scheme. Njernda is committed to offering opportunities for Community to be able to re-enter the workforce within Njernda, or at a Board level, in line with the Spent Convictions Act, pending their continued clear background check.

Written by Njernda Aboriginal Corporation staff member Sharyn Kelly and collaborator Karen Lee Mills, the beautiful story follows the journey of eight-year-old Billy Turtle.

Billy has to leave his Country on the Murray River to go into Foster Care in the city when his Nan falls ill. Billy is frightened, lonely and misses being home. Will there be someone on Country that can step in and help him?

conveying the importance of cultural connectedness for Aboriginal children who need Foster Care placement is the inspiration for the book.

Once it’s determined that a child will be placed into Foster Care, our goal is always for the child to remain on Country, with their mob and in surroundings familiar to them. But the sad reality is that if we can’t meet the care need in our local community, children sometimes need to be placed elsewhere, which only increases their confusion, uncertainty, and the trauma they experience.

Our hope is that the book will be a resource to highlight why being a Foster Carer in our local community is important.

What a powerful experience to walk the Lotjpatj Natjan Danak, the Yarning and Gathering Pathway, with our Yorta Yorta Mobs for the first time.

Lotjpati Natjan Danak is at the Winton Wetlands and was official opened with celebration on May 15.

The pathway is around one kilometre long, and is designed for all abilities.

It is landscaped in the shape of the Turtle, the Yorta Yorta totem, and the pathway leads to sculptures and artworks by 14 Yorta Yorta artists representing places, totems, cultural practices, and stories.

This is a very special place in our community and, after being delayed by the pandemic, it is so exciting to see this collaboration come together at last.

TRACEY'S SPEECH TO CAMPASPE RECONCILIATION WEEK CEREMONY

"I stand with you today on the country of the Yorta Yorta and Wollithiga people and it is a privilege to be here working at Njernda with community.

It's a beautiful part of the world so to work here is a privilege. I am the new CEO I've been a CEO for more than a decade and worked predominantly in these settings. I am thoroughly impressed by the amazing work and the transformation of Aboriginal people's lives in our community. As I've moved around to our workplaces I've seen the amazing work Njernda is doing for Aboriginal people.

I'm a big believer in actions speaking louder than words Njernda is at Berrimba, helping our children in their early years and to make a good start at school; our doctors, nurses, allied health, Aboriginal Health Workers mobilised to take care of Aboriginal people during the pandemic and every day; our Family services are working to keep our young people safe and cared for; our youth workers supporting youth at a time when our economy is low, to grow up a new highly-functioning generation in community.

And to continue this good work we will focus what's important - good relationships and good processes and we are working on those and mindful that life is a lesson to learn every day.

I acknowledge the other amazing services in the community transforming people's lives. I look forward to continuing to work with you to build on that and make it better and better everyday.

On a national level we have CTG, the Uluru Statement a voice in parliament. I want to see action there too.

Reconciliation is around being brave and having the conversations. At this local level, let's work on policy and strategy and let's do that together in the spirit of reconciliation. I'm so keen to have a chat and conversation

-So come and see me and talk to me and let's connect and get things working and continue to make things happen."

Belongingness and Connection: We want to ensure everyone has a connection to Njernda, by ensuring all community members can access services fairly and equitably.

Voice and recognition: Our staff ensure people's voices are heard and their ideas are appreciated and considered.

Purpose: Our community has a clear understanding of an Aboriginal Community Controlled organisation's purpose and how they can contribute, be engaged and productive.

Dependability: We honour commitments which are within our control and our budget.

Respect apply to our engagement with Community, but also with each other within the workplace.

When employees respect each other and get along in the workplace, there is more productivity. This is seen in teamwork, thinking positively, listening, and communicating. We are more empathetic towards each other.

Respect makes us kinder to each other and can even work towards having lasting friendships.

Respect is fundamental to who we are as people and as a community, but respect must be earned by our actions and our words.

RESPECT - GIVING ATTENTION, HAVING REGARD AND GIVING CONSIDERATION TO; HAVING JUDGEMENT ON A PERSON'S WORTH, PERSONAL QUALITIES, ABILITY AND HONOR.

In my opinion the person who is respected has the ability to give respect, observes the other person's rights to an opinion, and will listen to and evaluate that opinion before making a decision on the worth of a person, their opinion and ideas.

Not all people agree on every issue, but that is what makes us a community.

Our differences are positive, this is what creates our identity (and culture).

Differences exist. respect is understanding that we are part of a community, and that each individual in the community is entitled to their own opinions and views which should be given due consideration whether we agree or disagree.

Each individual in community needs to be considered and feel valued.

Without this there is no relationships, no community just individuals and a dominant oppressor.

And a few times a year, we plan a major event.




