## NJERNDA'S CORPORATE SERVICES AND ADMINISTRATION TEAMS HAVE A NEW BASE!

THE CORPORATE TEAM AND THE EXECUTIVE HAVE OUTGROWN THE OLD IVY HOUSE SITE, AND HAS MOVED INTO A NEW AND ROOMY HEADQUARTERS AT 51 - 55 HEYGARTH STREET, ECHUCA.

The move will mean all of our Corporate Services team is in the same building and can operate more efficiently and effectively.

But the move will also free up space at Ivy House for the Aged Care team to provide more services, including Aged Care Packages (more news on this soon).

The new building will have space for exciting and important community projects going forward - and, importantly, meeting rooms and long-awaited space for community.

The new site is within walking distance to the centre of town (we are in the old bank building on the corner of High Street, opposite to McDonalds).

Community will be welcome to come in for a cuppa, to get information about Njernda services, get a hand with forms or have access to a computer if you need it. (Watch this space for information on the official opening.)

Plans for the move began under the former administration early last year.

#### **NEW EXECUTIVE STRUCTURE**

As part of moving forward and strengthening Njernda as a vibrant and progressive organisation, we now have in place a new corporate structure.

The structure was agreed upon during the Administration process to be the most appropriate and effective model for our organisation.

It provides clear lines of responsibility and is easy for community members to understand where the services you need to access fit within the Njernda operations.

### Njernda's Corporate Structure...

Each area of Njernda's operation is headed by a Director, and each Director is responsible to the CEO.

The new structure replaces the previous Managerbased model, The structure has been developed around a succession model that ensures each tier of management has direct support and communication with staff.

The Directors, which are currently in the recruitment process, will provide a high level of expertise and experience to further develop each department across areas of quality improvement, governance, compliance, stakeholder engagement and service delivery.

#### **BOARD MEMBER PROFIILE**

#### **JOHN KERR**

Board Member Njernda Aboriginal Corporation CEO of Moama Aboriginal Land Council (LALC)

I'm from Yorta Yorta Country. I grew up between Deniliquin and Moama, but I left Deniliquin when I was 15. Since then I've lived in Moama, Bendigo, Kerang and Shepparton, depending on where my work is. My first job after I left school was working in the forests with my grandfather burning charcoal and cutting firewood. I've got mainly a Natural Resource Management and Cultural Heritage Management background, but I also worked in mining and at Goulburn Valley Health as the HACC coordinator.

Now I am the Moama LALC CEO, and it suits me perfectly because I love meeting new people and helping community members. I've been there six years. Moama LALC has a mandate to protect cultural heritage and Country, and those are the things I'm passionate about. My wife is also in natural resource management and four years ago we worked together to start the Bitjawalla natural resource management team, which is something I am proud of. Bitjawalla means "Fire and Water" and we now have around 12 crew members working to protect important sites in the region.

I nominated for the Njernda Board because I had seen the difference (as a former board member of Moama LALC) that a good, functioning board can make within a community. At Moama, we had our issues but when I joined the board it showed me what community-orientated people can do when they put their heads together. I had never really thought about being on the Njernda board before, but I thought why not? Let's see what positive outcomes we can achieve.

I think the most important role we have is bringing community back together - we have been through a lot here, and there are still people hurting in community. But we've got to work now to heal those wounds and move on. It's not about how hard you fall - it's about how you get back up.


I am a proud Yorta Yorta/Wamba Wamba woman who was born and raised in Shepparton.




**Belongingness and Connection:** We want to ensure everyone has a connection to Njernda, by ensuring all community members can access services fairly and equitably.

**Purpose:** Our community has a clear understanding of an Aboriginal Community Controlled organisation's purpose and how they can contribute be engaged and productive.



It's a long way off...but we need your help now!


Have you, your family, friends, Elders you know of been an important person in the Njernda history?



## ENGAGING & CONNECTING WITH OUR KIDS

The Youth Team is working on new programs for after school such as a gym program using our Ninyi Health Gym. Our music, homework and cultural arts programs at the Youth Hub are already popular.

We have been working with Baroona staff on starting a workshop for our youth to learn skills in mechanics, welding and tool handling at Baroona Farm's shed.

We regularly interact with our kids at school to ensure they are engaged and supported in any areas they find difficult. We have also engaged with our kids who are disengaged from education to try to encourage them to participate in positive activities.

Our Koori Kids Engagement Worker Sissy Cooper has been focusing on traditional cultural workshops within the schools and working with youth individually on cultural arts. The bonds being formed through cultural art and

showing young people how to tell a story through their art has been an awesome process to watch.

Rochester Secondary School has requested some cultural support and we are working with them to provide some cultural workshops around dancing and arts.

#### What are we doing?


Niernda's Aboriginal Best Start Partnership includes representatives from local Early Years agencies and service providers.

Our current partnership group includes delegates from Niernda (Family Services, Medical, • That children and families actively engage with Berrimba, Youth Services), Echuca Regional Health, Shire of Campaspe, Shine Bright, Department of Education, Intereach, Save the Children, VACSAL and Anglicare. Our partnership group meets as a whole once per term with working group meetings on focus key areas in between.

#### The two areas we focus on are:

- That children engage and participate in playgroups, early childhood education and kindergarten to support them to enter school as confident and involved learners.
- Maternal Child Health Services, attending key ages and stages visits to optimise health, wellbeing, safety, learning and development.

Focus Areas for 2022: Enrolments, Transitions, Allied Health Supports, Playgroup (Yarka Yaka Daya), Birth Certificates, Early Years Workforce.

#### **CULTURAL SAFETY AT ECHUCA REGIONAL HEALTH**

#### From Echuca Regional Health

Echuca Regional Health is seeking to understand and learn more about the experiences of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, respectfully referred to as Aboriginal people, who have received care at our health service.

We have committed to undertaking a deep dive into the cultural safety of our health service and developing a plan, with our Aboriginal community, to improve the experience of Aboriginal people and provide culturally safe care to all.

The first step of the work being undertaken is to achieve a broad level understanding of the current situation via a community survey.

We are asking all Aboriginal people who have visited any service at Echuca Regional Health, including but not limited to the Hospital, Emergency Department, Hopwood Centre, Dental Clinic or Consulting Suites to please take the opportunity to have their say and provide us with the valuable feedback and insights that will allow us to work on improving Aboriginal cultural safety for our community.
